

Playing is a radical gesture

If I think about utopia, I imagine it as something huge, global, meanwhile as something in a small context: my home can be a place of utopia, my performance in the space, everyday resistance can be an utopia as well. In my opinion, the existence of utopia is rooted in the concept of imagination, related with socialization and the schooling system that define the individual and the collective, and limits the possibilities and extents of the social contract.

Connoted to this phenomena, the schooling system decides our relation to imagination linked to utopia, political system, collective memory, the concept of money, human rights and social standards, etc., nevertheless define the access to the act of renegotiation of these ruling ideas and norms.

Regarding these factors, I could illustrate the way of utopia I imagine as a playground, more precisely as an experimental playground, such as Speilclub Oranienstraße 25* was in Berlin,(or on the level of concept: the Gaudiopolis experimental community by Gábor Sztehlo*, or the summer camp of Eszter Leveleki*).

In these kind of playgrounds the instruments and elements can be used and discussed in huge variety, players need to cooperate with the others at least on the level of concept- but mostly as well for the actual successful playing action- and space is primarily proclaimed as a safe but fluid territory - space because of the rules they discuss and for equal power relations, and fluid, because there are innumerous way to use the space.

To acquire this capability to use this space, we need to be/stay free on the level of imagination, and regarding this, schooling system represents a crucial aspect. The fundamentals of the radical imagination and radical pedagogy movements are the principal demands for intervention to the political space, the skills of everyday resistance, the productive withdrawal action and the balanced access to knowledge and rights, among many others. The possibility of taking action has been moved from the future to the present, inspiring solidarity, self-representation/governity and calling for rethinking collectively the outstanding schemes. These fundamentals describe the what and the how in the learning method.

As this is not a quality owned inherently in each individual, rather than a collectiva's collective language and network of rules/bunch of utopias that they share in sake of develop a better present, and a better future as well, we need to reshape the concept of general education, and the relation of general education to individuals, as Paulo Freire and many other great thinker and activist contributed to this idea, or like Situationists who tried to recreate a new approach on spaces, existence and politics. The radical imagination/pedagogy is linked to notions such as inclusivity, accessible knowledge, importance of dialogue, the objectification of the reality, the critical view and problem-posing, the praxis where reflection and action are present together, false consciousness, whilst connected to actions and units like volunteering, working-groups, co-creating power relations, activism, protesting,knowledge production and educational turn.

Although I mentioned mostly notes on early education, not only children are affected or targeted, but all players regardless of their status and age. Utopia-playground is an unconditional non-space, where the willingness of rethinking existing frameworks of the society, reclaiming the right of self representation and solidarity as well as the access of knowledge are the basic bricks, which can drive the community to better-quality decisions. That process is close to an immanent flawless way of existence and that's what I define as an utopia, to play something in a productive way, meanwhile we play the reality.

- 1.The AG Spielumwelt [PlayEnvironment project group] existed at the nGbK (formerly NGBK) from 1969 to 1972. Its founding ideal was to develop artistic practices with and for children, so as to raise critical awareness of capitalism's effects. Instead of the illusions the toy industry promised, children were to build a realistic play environment—a space where they would acquire self-confidence enough to handle the challenges of everyday life. in e-flux https://www.e-flux.com/announcements/249193/spielclub-oranienstrasse-25/
- 2. Between 1945-50, a concept of an imaginary "infant state" was developed by a Hungarian evangelical pastor, who ran a secret shelter for orphans.
- 3. Eszter Leveleki, who was the pioneer of alternative pedagogy in Hungary since 1938, conducted a child care house, summer camps and later worked as a toy developer. She held summer-long camps where kids used the forest and the camping place and the capital of their utopian space, and they built brick by brick the rules of their state.





OLEKSANDR VASENKO - UKRAINE



The form of government in an utopian country is a republic. The peculiarities of such a republic are:

1) Electivity of higher authorities. Knowledge of state history and fluency in the state language are mandatory for every candidate for the position. One cannot work for the weal of people without feeling a spiritual connection with people.

Voluntary military service is mandatory - a person capable of self-sacrifice is less likely to use status to satisfy his own ambitions.

- 2) Term of authorities: a person may be in authority for an indeterminate period, but every 5 years all citizens with the voting right will vote to support the extension of these powers. And if there is no such support, elections are announced.
- 3) Responsibility of higher authorities to the people. If the person in authority did not have extension, then a commission is established to investigate the activities of this person. If there are any evidences, criminal proceedings are instituted.
- 4) The rule (domination) of normative acts.

In such a state, there are two types of citizens - with the right to vote and without such a right. Both types of citizens enjoy all the rights and freedoms provided for in such a state, except to elect higher authorities. To acquire citizenship with the voting right, you must pass a voluntary conscription service, pass exams for the level of knowledge of the state language and knowledge of history, pass a test for the level of critical thinking and have a high level on the appropriate scale. If a citizen with the right to vote has abused this right, he is deprived of it for the lifetime.



OLEKSANDR VASENKO - UKRAINE



All services in the state are paid. Citizens pay taxes for the maintenance of the army and general state structures- parliament, government, president, and so on. Virtually all information is publicly available, except for certain secret articles prescribed by law. Access to classified information can be obtained by any citizen with the right to vote, who has undergone appropriate training and verification. In case of disclosure of these data, such a citizen is punished with the maximum (highest) penalty. His children and grandchildren are deprived of citizenship. In addition, citizens pay for the activities of their community in accordance with the proposed plan. In particular, law enforcement agencies, such as police stations, are hired by community members. But the overall leadership belongs to the state government.

There are no bans on weapons, drugs, etc. in the state. Drugs can be obtained free of charge by any of the citizens in special centers, performing the most primitive and dirty work. Because drugs are legalized and free, there is no need to buy them from mafia groups, which leads to a reduction in the overall criminal level.

The most prestigious and highly paid profession is a judge. Judges study at specialized universities of judging, upon graduation the results of their training and personal characteristics are publicly available. A judge is an elected position. That is, the citizens of a certain region elect a judge in accordance with the above conditions. State-level judges are elected by universal suffrage. In case of detection of a criminal offense, the judge receives a penalty for the crime 3 times higher than if such a crime was committed by another citizen. The children and grandchildren of such a judge lose the right to study at the University of Judges or are dismissed from the position of a judge.

Economy: State property is prohibited in the state. Percentage quotas are provided for the availability of territories or facilities financed by communities (certain regional associations are analogous to a oblast or rayon). For example, such supported areas may include cultural, conservation sites, in special cases educational institutions, and so on. All civilian strategic facilities are under the control of the military, but are managed by hired civilians. If the entrepreneurial activity is carried out by a citizen of the state, he has tax benefits, non-citizens of the state do not have such benefits.



OLEKSANDR VASENKO - UKRAINE



All decisions in the state are based on statistical analysis and scientific calculations, which are publicly available. And in the event that a decision is made by the higher authorities without such an analysis, all the representatives involved are suspended from work for the duration of the investigation. In case of force majeure or urgent situation, the President of the country may make a sole decision specifying the term (up to 3 years) for its implementation. An appropriate analysis is then carried out and if the decision was adequate to the situation then no sanctions are applied.

Education: preparation is based on personal aptitudes. The content of primary school education is compulsory for all. There is also a constant monitoring of pupils' abilities. In the future, based on the collected data, the student is asked to choose subjects based on his inclinations. The development of students' critical thinking and a scientific approach to working with information is mandatory at all levels of education. The teacher is criminally liable for disseminating pseudo-scientific or fake information.

The general idea of utopia is in the maximum freedom of the individual and the realization of their own inclinations and desires. The task of the state is to provide him with favorable conditions and protection.




